Dad's cancer diagnosis inspired Kennesaw State student's awardwinning research

One of the most important lessons students who venture into data science are taught is that the data they analyze tell stories. At Kennesaw State University's Fall Analytics Day, **Desyne Martinez's** project told a powerful personal story through data.

Martinez, a senior, presented his semester research project on stage 3 of multiple myeloma, a

rare form of bone marrow cancer. It was exactly what his father, who Martinez idolizes, had been diagnosed with in 2020 and is still battling.

It served as the inspiration for his Analytics Day project, a semester-end event in the <u>School of Data Science and Analytics</u> where both undergraduate and graduate students have poster presentations of their research projects.

Get Involved

Here are some quick ways to get started through the Office of Undergraduate Research:

- First-Year Scholars Program: Designed to pair first-year students with faculty mentors who will guide them on research in their disciplines.
- <u>Undergraduate Research Club</u>: Any student can join and conduct research as part of an interdisciplinary team.
- <u>Current Research Projects</u>: Listing of projects to help undergraduates find faculty who are looking for assistance on their research activities.
- Vertically Integrated Projects (VIP) <u>Program</u>: Any student can complete a student application to work on a large-scale research project with faculty and other students.

You do not need to have a specific idea in mind when approaching a faculty member to do research. Many students work with faculty members on their research, especially at first. Undergraduate research opportunities are often competitive, so be sure to engage in behaviors that make you stand out from the crowd.
