Get Involved

Here are some quick ways to get started through the Office of Undergraduate Research:

- <u>First-Year Scholars Program</u>: Designed to pair first-year students with faculty mentors who will guide them on research in their disciplines.
- <u>Undergraduate Research Club</u>: Any student can join and conduct research as part of an interdisciplinary team.
- <u>Current Research Projects</u>: Listing of projects to help undergraduates find faculty who are looking for assistance on their research activities.
- <u>Vertically Integrated Projects (VIP) Program</u>: Any student can complete a student application to work on a largescale research project with faculty and other students.

You do not need to have a specific idea in mind when approaching a faculty member to do research. Many students work with faculty members on their research, especially at first. Undergraduate research opportunities are often competitive, so be sure to engage in behaviors that make you stand out from the crowd.

Undergraduate Research Club

The <u>Undergraduate Research Club (URC)</u> is a Registered Student Organization dedicated to promoting undergraduate research and creative activity at KSU.
